



KENNISON'S CORNER

Dear parents,

With each passing grade in school, there are always changes, some are very challenging and some not so much. The challenges are sometimes the curriculum, assignments/homework/ projects, the more independent work, new teacher expectations, or all three as our middle school students realize.

This year we added a new class called Historical Perspectives, or HP for our middle school students. HP was created to bridge the gap as it relates to our students overall writing skills. So to better prepare our students, this class was created to increase more writing during the school day. In creating this class, we wanted to keep in line with our mission which is "to provide a quality education that fosters academic excellence and integrates the traditions of the Roman Catholic faith in all curricular areas"; therefore, HP provides the students the opportunity to respond accordingly with our faith through their writing.

Anytime we add a new class or purchase a new curriculum, there is a learning curve for the teacher and student. For the teacher, it involves curriculum mapping which means we match content with Indiana standards (not common core) and then teaching strategies are considered in order to address student needs based on many data points, along with presenting age appropriate topics and content for each grade level. Our curriculum did not arrive until just this week. In the meantime, Mr. Fortunak used current events in class to discuss how we integrate our faith in these sometimes tragic events and allow students to apply this through writing. We actually had a student take action to help those impacted by a tragic current event that was discussed in class. Current events are not the primary focus of HP; however, it will still be an integral part of the curriculum.

We understand that some topics might be more sensitive than others, but our intentions are to be relevant to what the students are experiencing outside of our school. Mr. Fortunak will be sure to communicate in the Monday Memo the happenings and current events being discussed in HP. We have fixed the communication issue that occurred with Mr. Fortunak's Monday Memo posting. Always know that you can contact us anytime with questions/concerns you might have as it relates to a specific topic.
