




Hearing Exams This Week



<u>Hernandez Happenings: Social Emotional Learning</u>

Mrs. Hernandez kicked off her social emotional learning lessons at the beginning of September. Each classroom has a lesson once a week for 30 minutes and discusses different topics. The program being used is called Second Steps and includes activities, videos, discussions, and reflections. 1st through 5th grade begin each lesson with a brain building activity. Here is a summary of what each grade level has been working on this past month.

1st-The first grade has been working on paying attention, why it is important to pay attention, and what good paying attention looks like. We have also talked about how everyone gets distracted and strategies they can use when they encounter a distraction.

2nd-Second grade has been identifying skills they use to get better at something. We have also talked about how everyone makes mistakes and while they can be frustrating, mistakes help our brains grow and learn. This leads into helpful and unhelpful thoughts. Second grade identified how thinking a certain way can help them achieve their goal or not.

3rd-Third grade has been exploring their brains and what happens in their brain when they learn a new skill. Third grade now knows that the connections in their brains get stronger the more they practice a skill. In addition to practicing to grow their brains, they can also learn from others and try a new way of doing something!

4th and 5th-Fourth and fifth grade have been working on setting goals and the criteria for setting a good goal. When setting a goal, they learned that one must have a plan, check their progress, and roadblocks they may encounter while working towards their goal and change their plan if necessary.

Middle School-Sixth and seventh grade started Second Step lessons talking about empathy and helping others. We established guidelines and expectations for the classroom to keep a safe space for all. Then, the two grades learned about how to grow their brains and create new pathways. The classes then talked about growth mindset and fixed mindset and how thinking a certain way can affect our learning. **Eighth grade** also set guidelines and expectations for the class and then we dove into exploring their identities. They filled out an identity map and will use it in future lessons to see how they can use their personal strengths to develop an interest, skill, or ability.




